Essential Idea

ESSENTIAL IDEA**Choose the fluid model before the equation**

For a fluid at rest, think pressure and buoyancy. For moving fluid, think flow rate and conservation of mass before using Bernoulli.

pressure $\uparrow$ with depth; F_B = displaced-fluid weight; narrow steady flow $\rightarrow$ faster.

EXAMPLE A floating block, a diver below a surface, and water entering a narrow nozzle each require a different first model choice.

SENSEI NOTE Circle the target quantity first: pressure, force, buoyancy, flow rate, speed, or energy/pressure change. Then write the assumptions beside the equation.

QUICK ANSWERS • CHECK AFTER ATTEMPTING

Quick Answers and Explanations

Use these concise answers to check your recall and confidence—not only your final response.

QUICK RECALL**Recall Activity**

Pressure increases with depth; floating requires buoyancy to balance weight; narrowing increases speed for steady incompressible flow.

WHY IT WORKS The fastest reliable sequence is: identify statics versus flow, define the fluid and geometry, apply conservation/force balance, and verify the assumptions of the chosen equation.

CONFIDENCE CHECK**CONFIDENCE CHECK****Fluid Mechanics readiness check**

Pressure increases; buoyancy balances weight in floating equilibrium; speed increases as area decreases.

WHY IT WORKS A correct response separates statics from dynamics, distinguishes pressure from force, uses displaced fluid for buoyancy, applies continuity before Bernoulli, and states the model assumptions.
